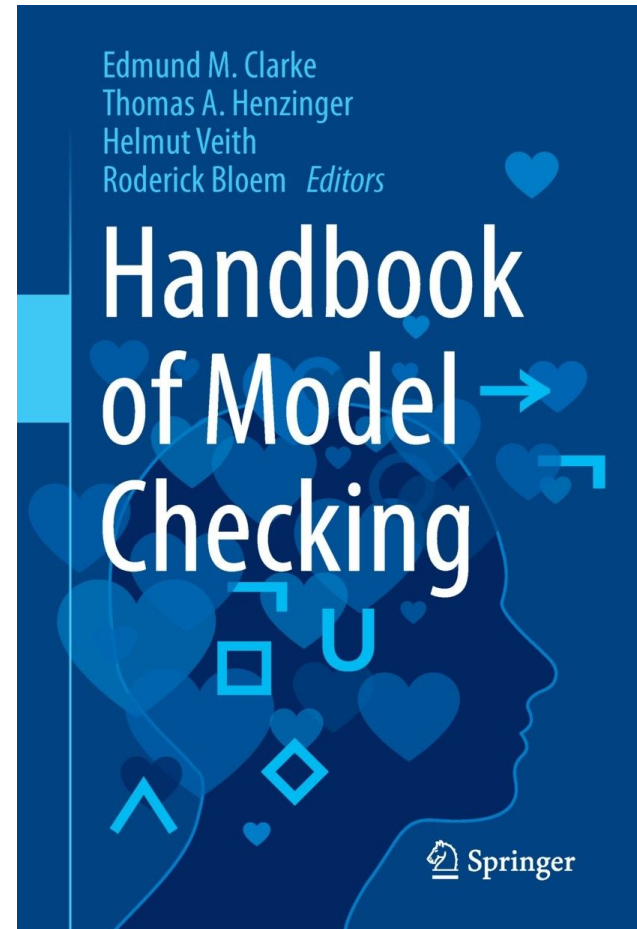

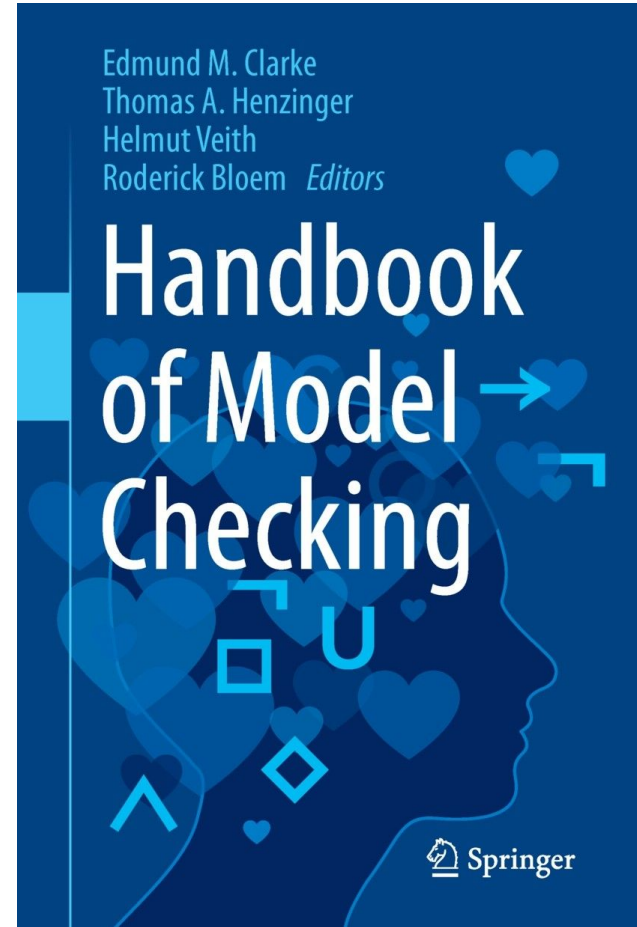

Written work (40%)



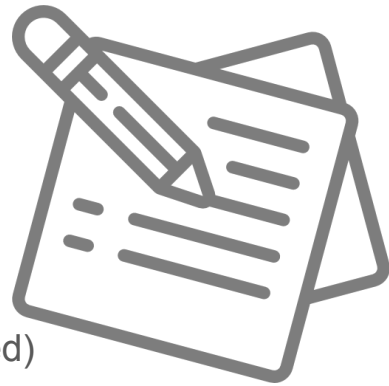
Presentation (40%)

Written Work

- Send **one week before** presentation
- 2-4 pages extended abstract (Fontsize 11, Latex template will be provided)
- Basis for the talk
- Basis for the listener to prepare questions
- Suggested structure (can and should be discussed with the supervisor)
 - Motivation
 - Problem statement
 - Preliminaries
 - Outlook to the talk

Presentation

- 25-30min oral presentation
- supported by slides (or whiteboard if you dare)
- present an interesting selection of your chapter (can and should be discussed with your supervisor)
